Tip

2-Finger Fun: (Requires a MacBook, a 17-inch MacBook Pro or an update to the latest (?) OS X version on the 15-inch MacBook Pro) Go into "System Preferences", then "Keyboard & Mouse", and "Trackpad". Activate "Place two fingers on trackpad and click button for secondary click."

By default, the hardware options (Volume, Num Lock, Screen Brightness, etc.) on the MacBook Pro (mine anyways) are active without needing to have the Function (fn) key selected, thus making that you need to do Function + F1 to F10 to use what's associated with the "F" keys, like Exposé (F11 and F12 don't have a hardware option associated with them). Go in "System Preferences", then "Keyboard & Mouse", and "Keyboard". Then, activate "Use the F1-F12 keys to control software features" to make it that you do "Function +" for the hardware features but you simply click for the "F" keys to activate things like Exposé.
